Making an Emergency Contact List

The Disaster Recovery Plan should contain a list of organizations that can be contacted in case of an emergency. Some of these groups are obvious such as the police and fire departments, but the others are numbers that can be called if the primary emergency notification system is down due to a local disaster. Other groups are part of the county, state, and federal government emergency management departments.

Emergency Organizations

- Police for security
- Fire department for medical and fire
- Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) for spills
- Local hospital for emergency room services
- County Emergency Management Agency
- State Emergency Management Agency
- Federal Emergency Management Agency

We would want to contact these organizations in a sequence, since not every disaster can be considered to have regional or national importance. In most cases, the local first responders have sufficient resources to handle the emergency.

Making an Emergency Contact List

In a word processing program, we create a new document. We type "Company Confidential" for the header. We then input "Emergency Contact List" for the document title.

Next, we insert a two column and one row table. We will type "Emergency Contact:" in the left cell of the table and "9-1-1" in the right cell of the table.

We place our cursor on the right side of row one of the table and press Enter twice to add two rows. We input the station number, address and phone numbers for the precinct. We can use the address to locate the station in case that the telephone system is down because of the disaster.

We can add additional rows to the table to add more emergency contacts. We then will add the fire department, the local hospital emergency room, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) office for spills, the county emergency management agency, the state emergency management agency, and the federal government emergency management agency.

We can turn of the border on the table if you do not wish to see the lines and the list will appear as shown in figure 3.5.

The Emergency Contact list should be in front of the DRP binder.
