Setup for Exchange Server


What we need to have on the server before loading Exchange Server 2003 is the following Windows 2003 components.

Running 2003 Server with SP3

ASP.Net


IIS with NNTP and SMTP

IIS with World Wide Web Services




Open Add or Remove Programs

We open the Control Panel and choose Add or Remove Programs. Then, we pick Add/Remove Windows Components. The Windows Components Wizard dialogue box will appear.




Add ASP.NET and IIS

Double click on the Applications Server and check ASP.NET in the Application Server window. Press the OK button.




Then, we double click on Internet Information Services (IIS) and then in the ISS window, select NNTP Service, SMTP Service, and World Wide Web Service checkboxes. Pick the OK button.




Complete Loading Components

After checking all of the components we want to add, we install them. We select the Finish button to end the initial phase of preparing the server to operate as an Exchange Server.



Internet Information Service (IIS) Manager


We visit Administrative Tools and open the Internet Information Service (IIS) Manager window. We choose Web Service Extensions and in the left pane, we allow ASP. Net.



Run Forestprep

To begin the Exchange server installation, we pick the Command Prompt at the Start Menu. We place the 2003 Exchange Server CD in the CD Rom drive.

We change directory to D:\English\|Exch2003\Ent\Setup|i386.



We type setup /forestprep to start the installation.


Microsoft Exchange Installation Wizard

We will be welcomed to the Microsoft Exchange Installation Wizard. We press the Next button to continue.




License Agreement

We have to concur with the license agreement to proceed. Pick the I agree option and we press Next to continue.




Component Selection

We choose a typical installation and we press the Next button.




Installation Type

At the Installation Type window, we will select create a new Exchange Organization, since this e-mail server is the first one on our domain. Our other choice is to join or upgrade an existing Exchange 5.5 Organization. We would use the second option if we were adding another Exchange server to our domain or upgrading the mail server. We should press the Next button to continue.



Organization Name

The name of our organization will be BradfordNet. We should press the Next button to advance.




Licensing Agreement


Installation Summary

We now will review the installation summary for the Exchange Server 2003. We will carry on by selecting the Next button.




Component Progress
