
Outlook 2007 Startup


E-mail Accounts

Opt for Yes and press the Next button to advance.




Account Setup

We annotate the manually configure server settings or additional server types checkbox and press Next to go on.




Choose E-mail Service

We select the Internet E-mail option.




Internet E-mail Settings


General Tab

We make a comment about the organization and reply e-mail.




Outgoing Server Tab

We visit the Outgoing Server tab to make a few more alterations. Our provider will use the same settings for incoming and outgoing mail.




Connection Tab






Setup Finished
