

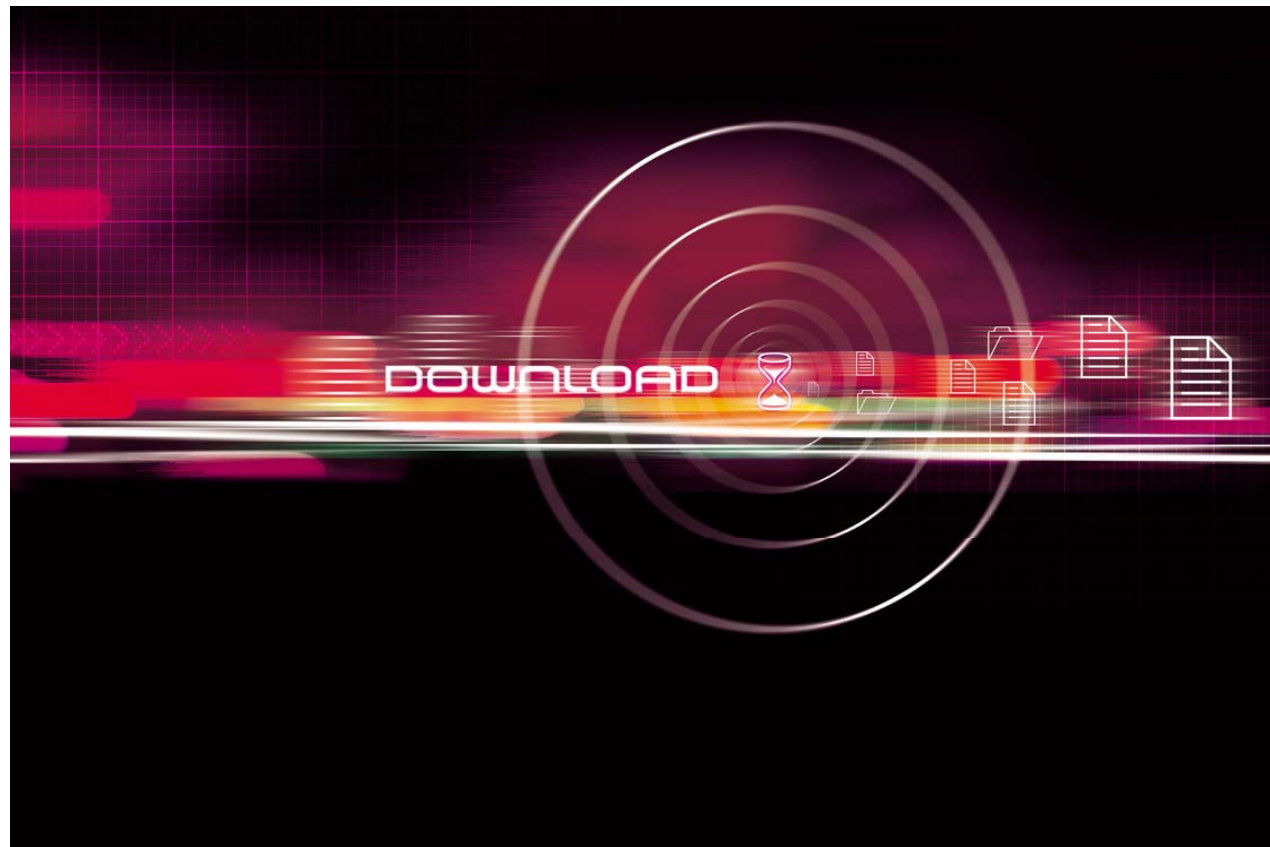

Windows Update

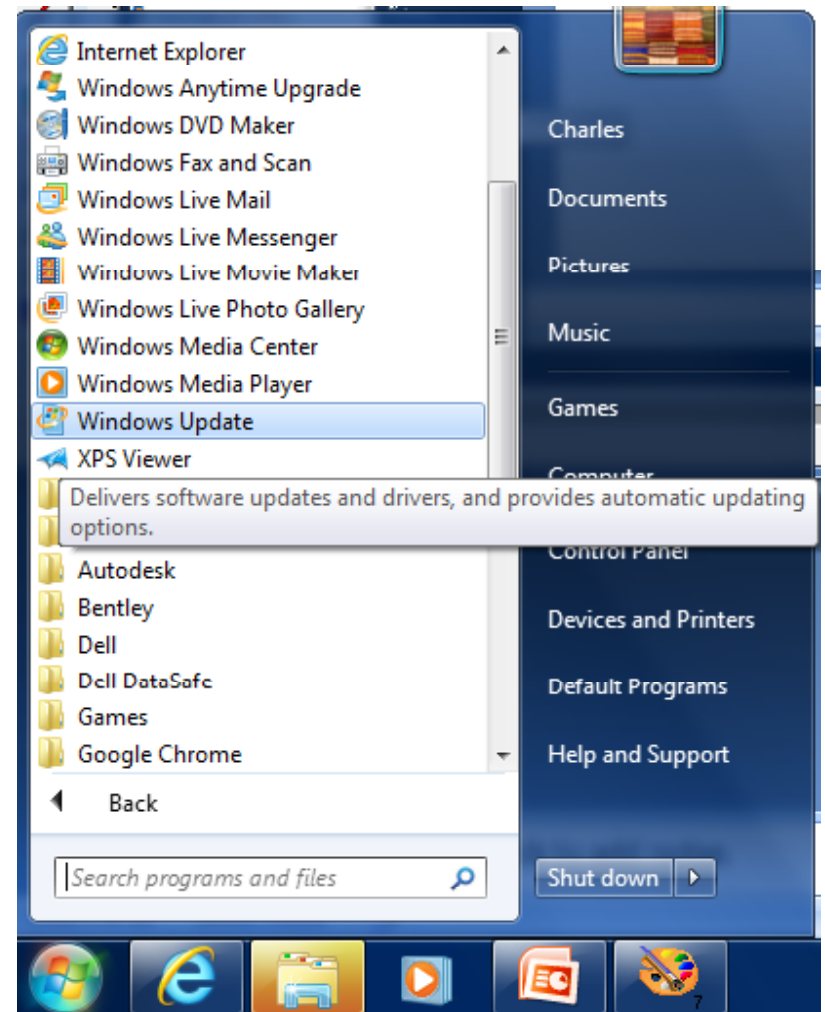
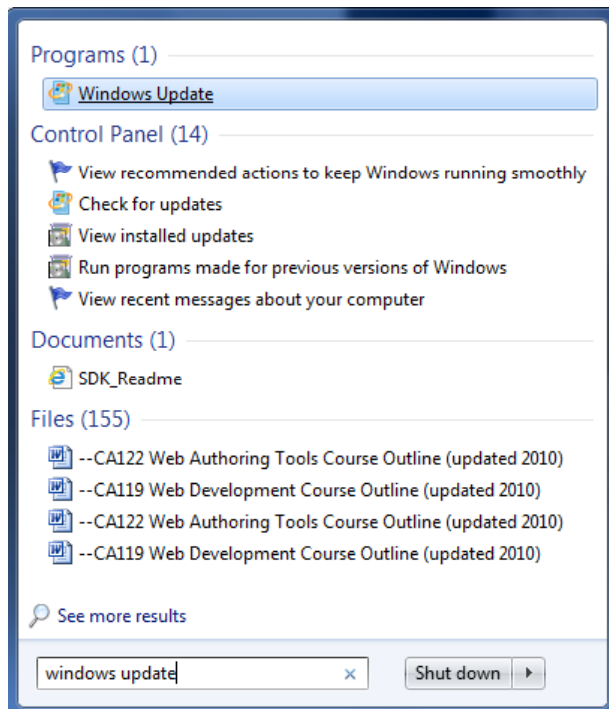
To close the holes in the Windows Operating Systems, we need to install critical updates regularly.

We can also add important and optional updates to fine tune our system.



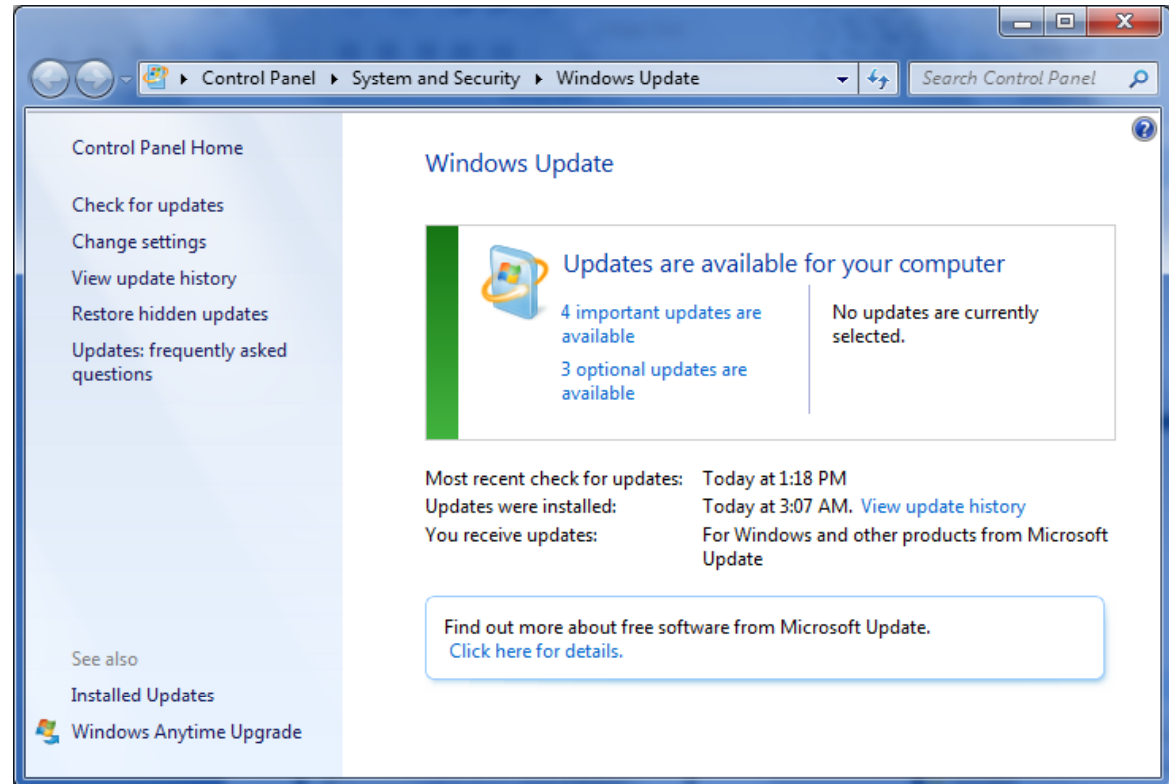
Windows Update

To start the Windows Update, we choose Programs, and select Windows Update. Or we can type “Windows Update” in the search textbox on the Start menu.



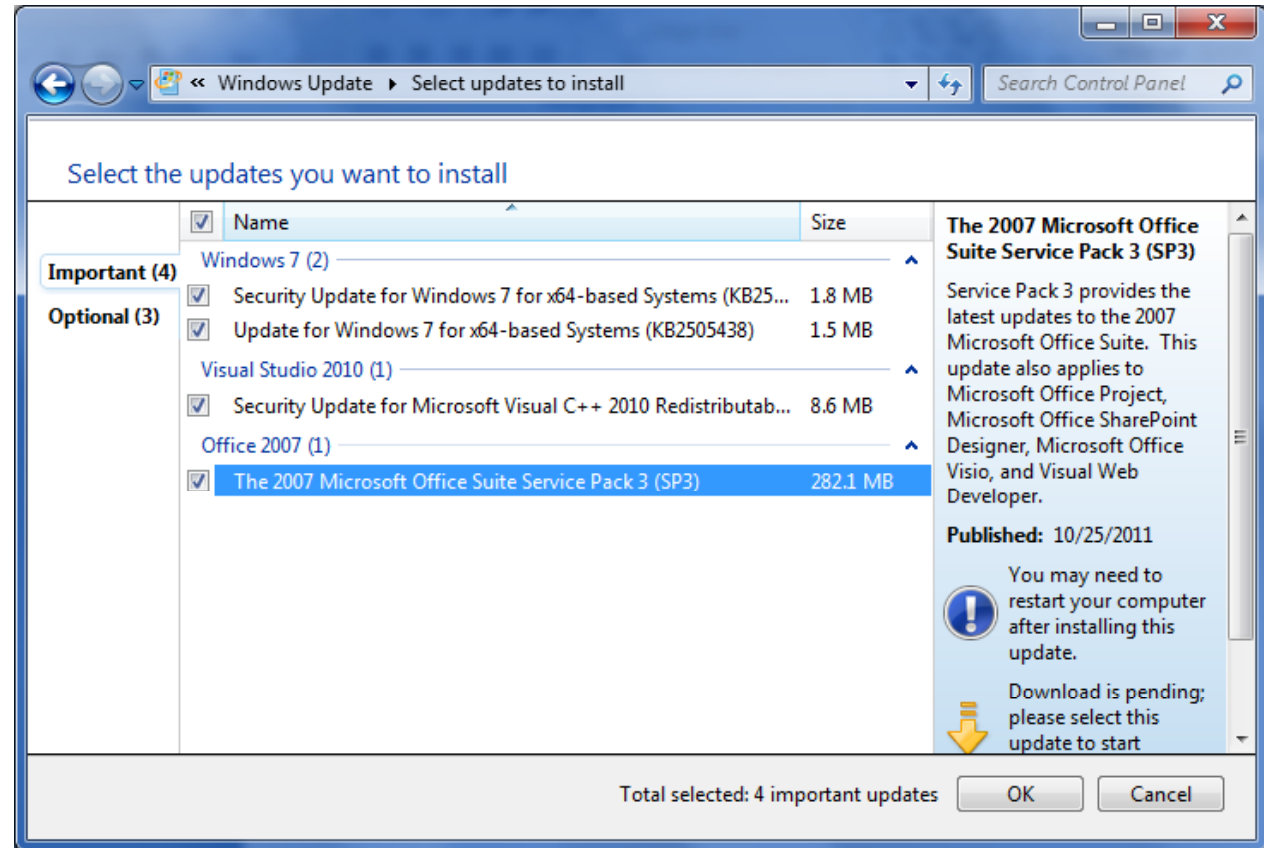
Windows Update Dialogue Box

When we observe the Windows Update dialogue on our desktop, we purposely look for critical and important updates. We can also add the optional one if we desire. We double click on the blue update hyperlink we want to add to the computer.



Select the Updates

We will annotate the checkboxes for all four of the important Windows updates.



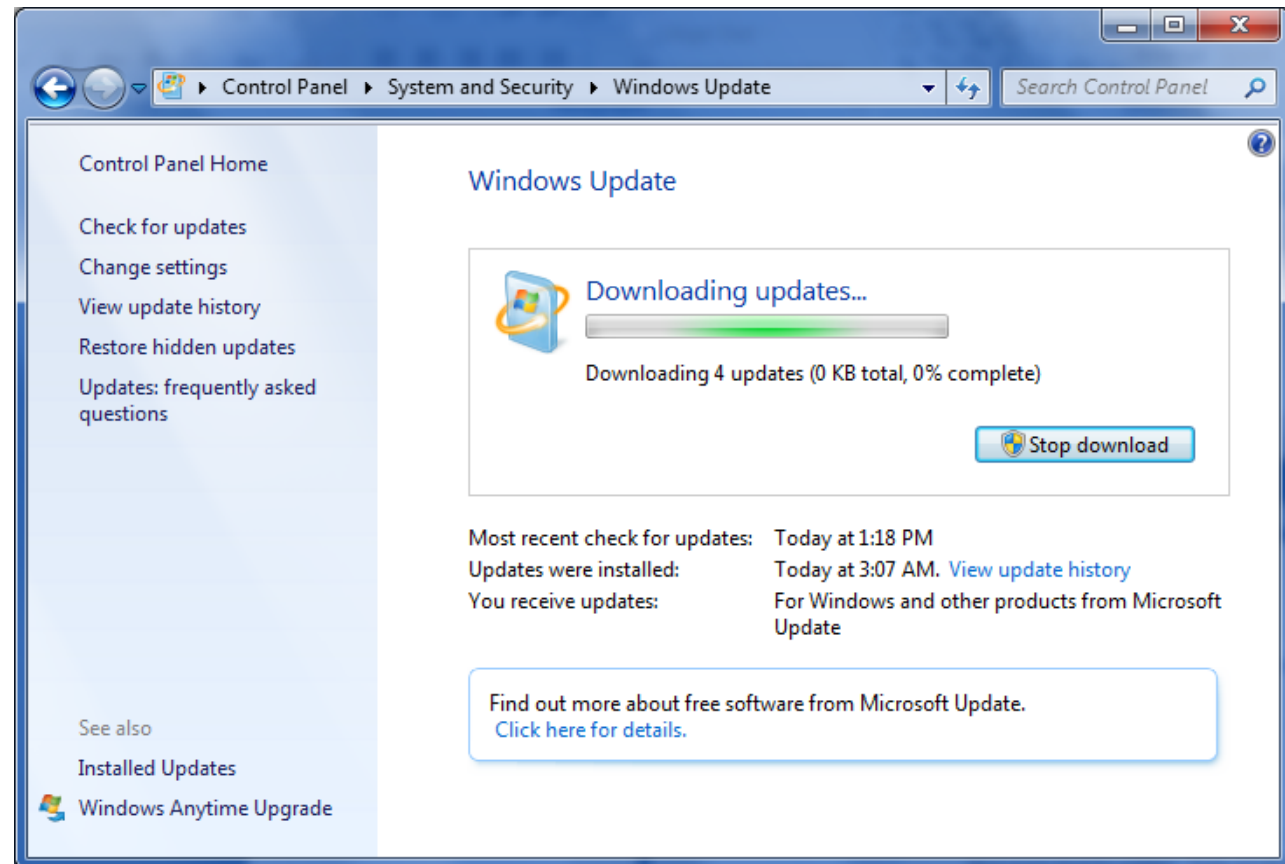
Install Updates

To download and install the selected updates, we push the Install updates button.



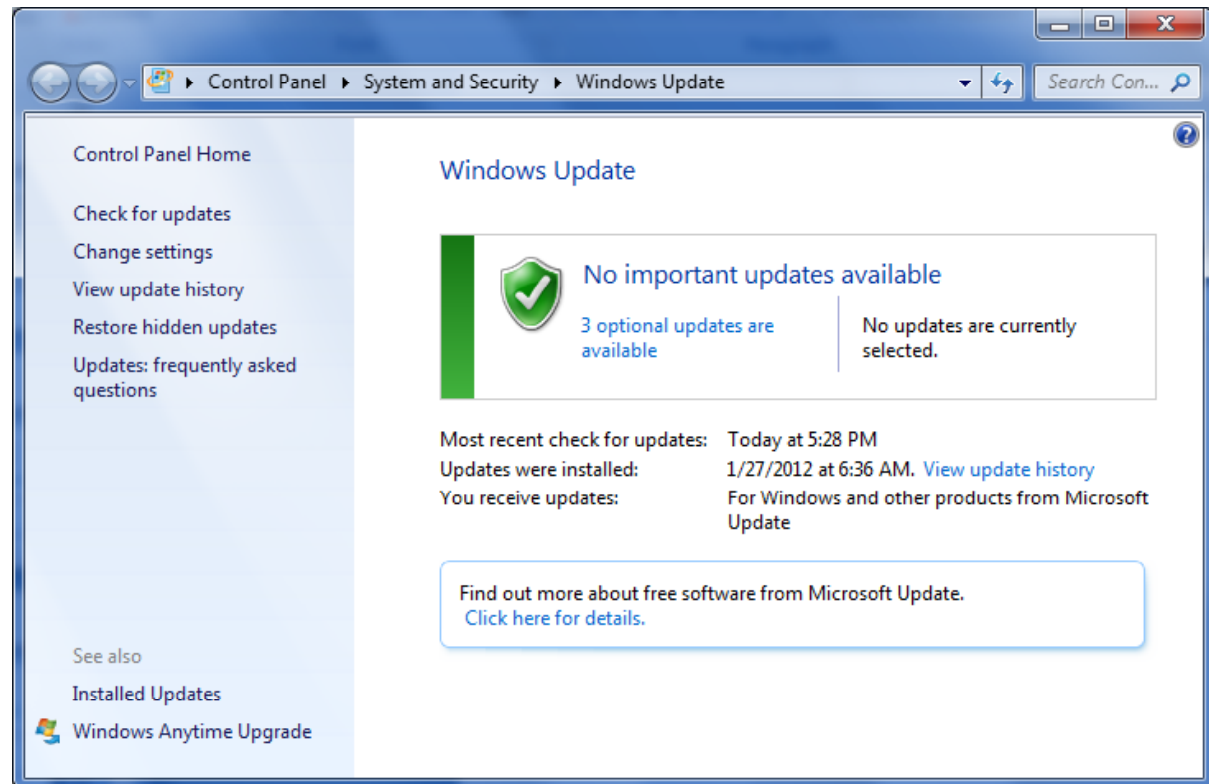
Downloading Updates

Now, the operating system will be patched. We have the option to stop the download, but we should allow the system to complete the installation.



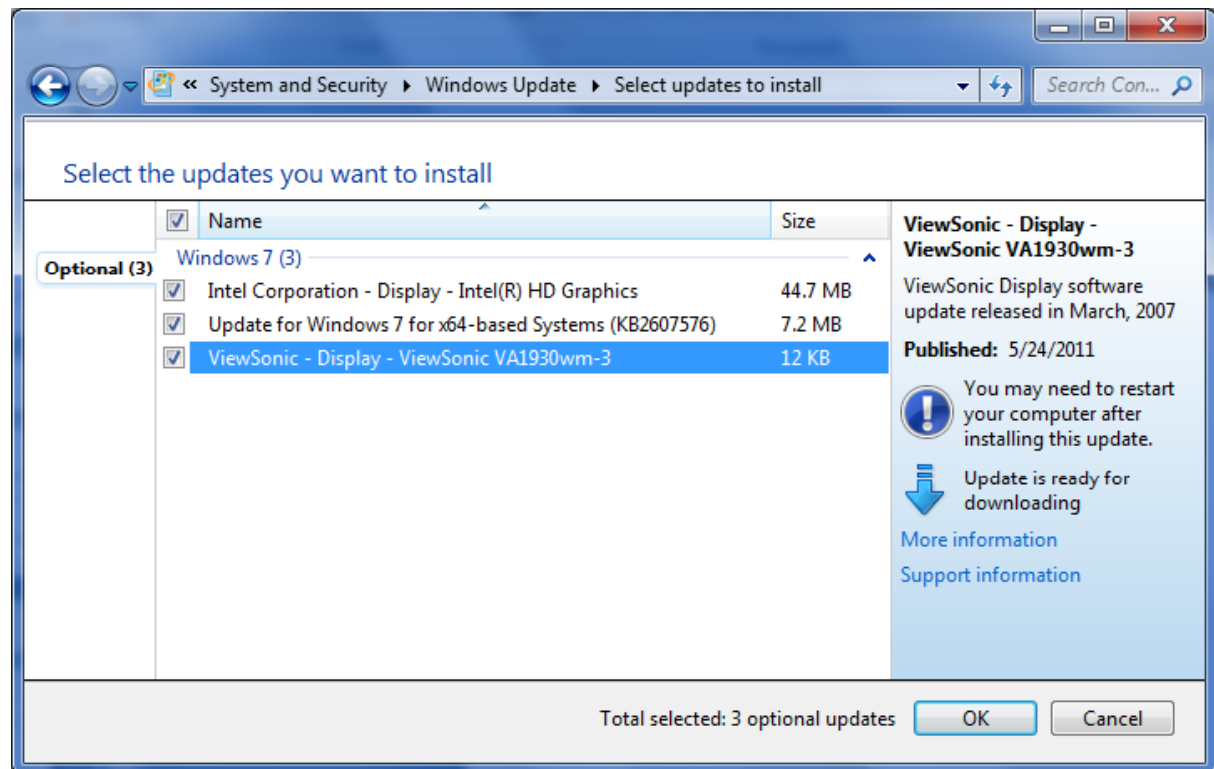
Windows Update Complete

All of the critical and important updates are loaded.



Select the Updates

We will annotate the checkboxes for all three of the important Windows updates.



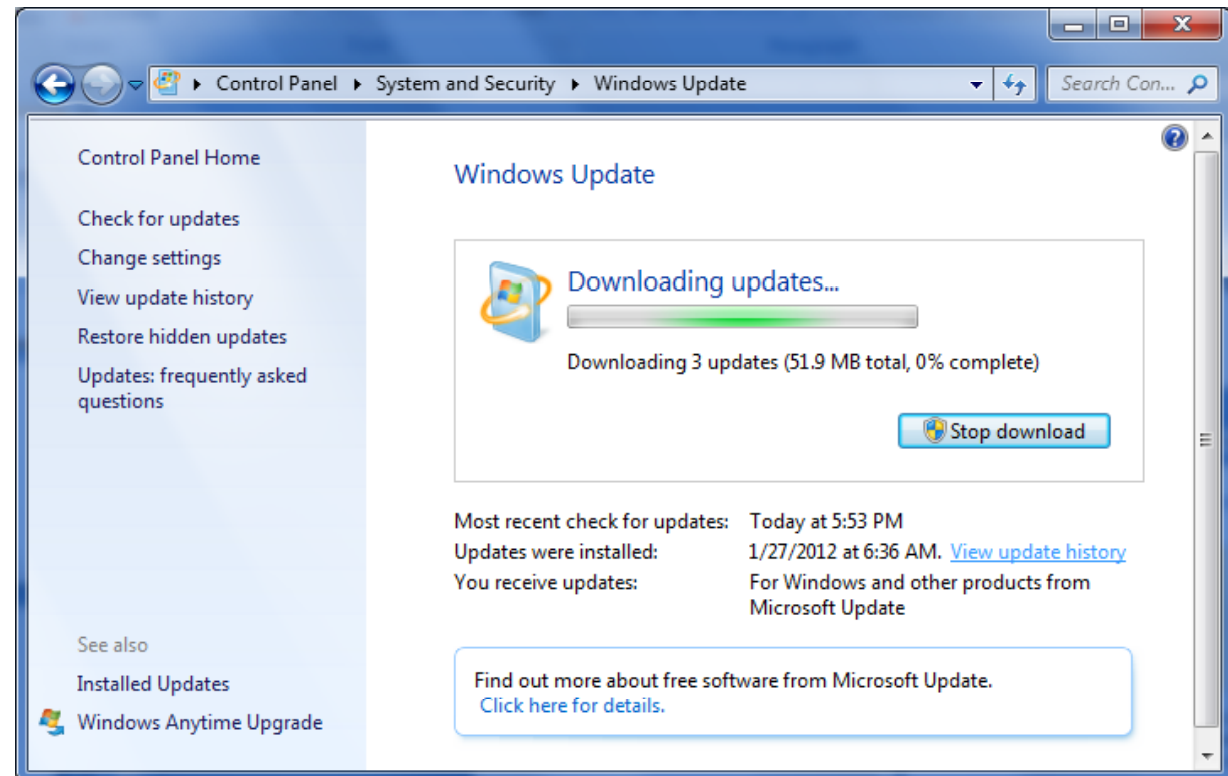
Install Update

Again, to download and install the selected updates, we push the Install updates button.



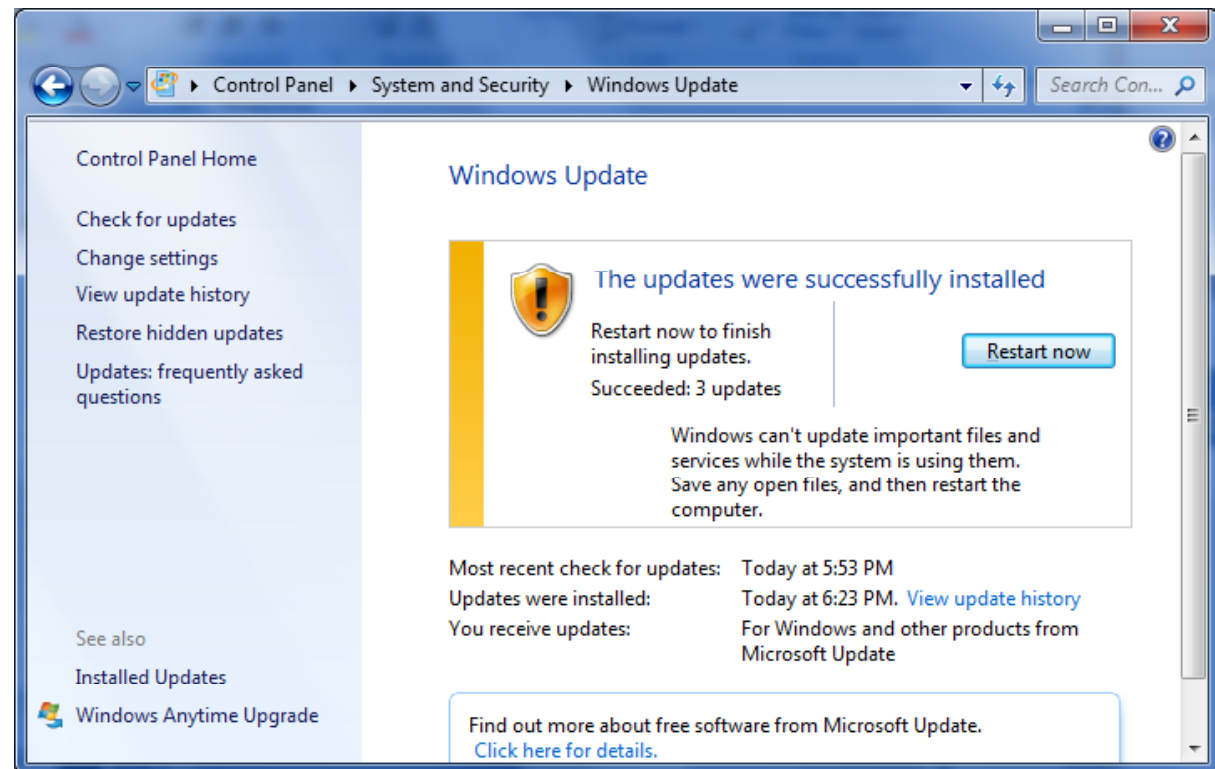
Downloading Updates

Once more, the operating system will be patched. We have the option to stop the download, but we should allow the system to complete the installation.



Optional Update Complete

All of the optional updates are loaded. We will now restart the computer by pressing the restart button.



Windows is Up to Date

After the computer system restarts, we can check the Windows Update dialogue box and we see the green check mark and our operating system is up to date.
